M. Robert Koren '44, of Koren, Bertel & Hoey, in Buffalo.


Gerald S. Lippes '64, of Lippes, Kaminsky, Silverstein, Porter, Mathias & Wexler, in Buffalo.

# William P. Foster '33 Honors Memory of Darwin D. Martin

illiam Powell Foster, 83, of Canandaigua, N.Y., has made a \$10,000 gift to the University at Buffalo Foundation, Inc.
The gift is in memory of Darwin D. Martin, a prominent Buffalo industrialist in the early 20th century who served as Foster's mentor in the hotel business, according to Joseph J. Mansfield, president of the UB Foundation.

While attending UB Law School, Foster '33 worked evenings as a night clerk in the Hotel Stuyvesant, which was owned by Martin. He remained in the hotel business, as general manager of the Hotel Rochester, from 1946 until 1954. It was there he met his wife Mary, Public Health Educator of Monroe County.

In 1954 Foster decided to return to his legal career. He served as trial counsel for the Monroe County attorney's office from 1958 until his retirement in 1972.

A long-time contributor to the Law School, in 1984 Foster and his wife established the Hon. Robert Foster Thompson Memorial Scholarship Fund to provide loans to deserving students working their way through school. Thompson, who served as a justice of the State Supreme Court and associate justice of the Appellate Division until his death in 1937, had provided financial assistance for many college students, including William Foster.
